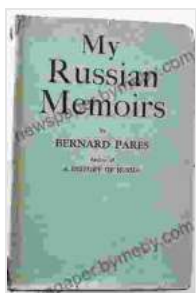


My Life For The Book: A Journey of Passion, Dedication, and Sacrifice

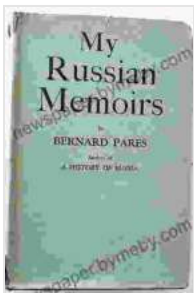

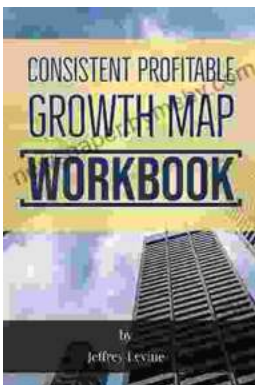
